Here are the recipes for the two dishes that I brought to our guild meeting on Tuesday. Thanks for putting them in the newsletter.

Broccoli Cheese Cornbread

4 eggs, beaten
2 sticks melted butter
1 medium onion, chopped
1 - 12 oz. carton cottage cheese
1 package chopped broccoli, thawed
2 boxes Jiffy Cornmeal Mix

Mix together the eggs, butter, onion, cottage cheese and broccoli. Add the Jiffy Cornmeal Mix. Mix well. Pour mixture into a greased 12 inch cast iron skillet. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Cut unto wedges to serve.

Hash Brown Casserole

2 pounds frozen hash brown potatoes, thawed
1 teaspoon salt
1 - 8 oz. carton sour cream
1 can cream of chicken soup
2 cups Cheddar cheese, grated
1/2 cup onion, chopped
1/2 cup margarine, softened
1/4 teaspoon pepper

Mix all the ingredients together except the potatoes. Mix well. Stir in the thawed potatoes. Pour into a greased 9 X 13 baking dish. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until done.

Note: I thaw the potatoes just enough to separate them.
